The staff has some recommended changes to the postseason wrestling formats for the next classification period.

14. Collegiate School of Memphis Requests TSSAA Membership

If approved, the school will be placed in DII, West Region, District 6 and plans to participate in boys' basketball, cross country, girls' soccer, and track and field. It should be noted that, if approved, Collegiate School of Memphis will have to return to TSSAA as an Affiliate Member. This means that the school would have all rights of membership but could not compete in any postseason tournament competition for one year.

The Board has always specified a set amount of money to be divided amongst the participating schools after the DI and DII tournaments. With limited attendance at both events this year, we need to decide how much will be allocated for distribution.

17. TSSAA/ TMSAA Summer Sports Calendar

We have not allowed any scrimmages, jamborees, or play-days during the pandemic. The Board needs to decide how we are going to handle summer practices and team camps. This also includes 7 on 7 in football.

18. Grace Baptist Academy Football Request

Grace Baptist Academy is stating they will not be able to field a football team the next two years due to situations beyond their control. The administration is requesting that they be allowed to participate in the postseason basketball series during this time.

19. TSSAA BlueCross BlueShield Football Championship Site

The Board will need to decide where we will host the football championships the next two-year cycle. The staff will discuss the bids received by the deadline, submitted by Cookeville and Chattanooga.

20. Williamson County Schools Requests Eligibility Exception for Online Students

Representatives from Williamson County Schools will be present to discuss their online platform for next school year and how it will impact eligibility. Their request is to allow the online students to play for their zoned school.

21. Robertson County Innovation Academy Requests TSSAA Membership for 2021-22

This is a public school in the Robertson County school system. The school will include freshman for the first time for the 2021-22 school year. Their request is to allow the freshman to co-op with Springfield High School.

22. Jackson Central Merry High School Requests TSSAA Membership

Jackson Central Merry High School is a public school under the jurisdiction of the Jackson Madison County School System. The school will be reopening in 2021-22 with 400 students in grades 9-12. If approved, the school plans to participate in Division I football (JV only for the next two years), basketball, baseball, softball, volleyball, track and field, golf, tennis, cross country, soccer, and girls' soccer. Jackson Central Merry High School will be placed in Class 2A, Region 7 in football; Class A, District 14 in basketball, baseball, and softball; Class A, District 12 in volleyball; Class A, West in track and field; Class A, District 15 in golf and tennis; Class A-AA, Region 7 in cross country, and Class A, District 12 in soccer and girls' soccer. It should be noted that, if approved, the TSSAA Bylaws require that Jackson Central Merry High School will have to return to TSSAA as an Affiliate Member. This means that the school would have all rights of membership but could not compete in any postseason tournament competition for one year.

23. Chattanooga School for the Liberal Arts Requests TSSAA Membership

Chattanooga School for the Liberal Arts is a public school under the jurisdiction of the Hamilton County Board of Education. The school will be a K-9 school, adding freshmen for the first time in 2021-22. There will be 50 students in the 9th grade next

year. If approved, the school plans to participate in Division I basketball, baseball, softball, volleyball, track and field, golf, tennis, cross country, soccer, and girls' soccer. CSLA plans to seek cooperative agreements with another school in the sports of football and wrestling. Chattanooga School for the Liberal Arts will be placed in Class A, District 5 in basketball, baseball, and softball; Class A, District 4 in volleyball; Class A, East Section in track and field; Class A, District 5 in golf and tennis; Class A-AA, Region 3 in cross country, and Class A, District 5 in soccer and girls' soccer.
